SUMMARY FOR MKLM BUDGET SPEECH FOR 2021/2022 FINANCIAL YEAR PRESENTED BY MKLM MAYOR, CLLR RALESOLE DIALE

The Budget speech was presented on the 26th May 2021 at Council meeting, here is the **Budget summary as follows:**

As the Mayor of Moses Kotane Local Municipality, I would like to applaud both councillors and administration who made sure that despite Covid-19, the Municipality comply with all systems that needs to be in place i.e. ordinary council meeting have been successfully held monthly, IDP/Budget council meeting was held on the 09th April, MPAC consultative meetings were achieved a comprehensive oversight report was tabled.

Achievements on the administration:

ŸThe current administration managed to fill Heads of Departments or Senior Management positions that were vacant for a long time.

YMoses Kotane local municipality received a Disclaimer audit opinion in the year 2015/2016, also 2016/2017 however we then did everything in our power to ensure we move out from bondage of Disclaimers to Qualified Audit opinion in the year 2018/2019 Financial year also in the 2019/2020. There has been a great improvement with Audit opinion since appointments of the current senior management. This also was possible because of the Council Oversight.

YLaunch of Anti-corruption and fraud campaign which took place at Kwa-Maritane and various campaigns have since been rolled.

ŸLaunch of the Safe and Clean City campaign that takes places every Friday and, it is a service delivery propeller/activator in our various areas through filling potholes, grass cutting, grading of the roads, eradicating illegal dumping. Most importantly we saw our municipality working together with various stakeholders, Mining Houses, Private sectors, other governments departments in rendering collective services to the people within our municipality. Indeed the programme showed that we are one Government.

YAll these have increased the services rendered to people and decrease service protests within our municipality.

- 1.1 Kago ya ditsela (Roads and Storm Water): a total budget of R 60 Million has been budgeted for Ward 21, Ward 15, Ward 26, ward 8 re tsweletse go netefatsa seemo sa ditsela se a tokafala.
- Thebolo ya metsi (Water Infrastructure): a total budget of R 71 Million 1.2 has been budgeted for water augmentation ,construction of bulk pipelines, installation of storage tanks and reservoirs and refurbishment of water treatment plant in ward 22, ward 31, Ward 30, ward 17, Ward 26, Ward 19, Ward 18, Ward 14, ward 28, Ward 1.
- Sanitation (kgeleloleswe)- a total of R11 ,8 Million has been 1.3 budgeted.
- Sports Facilities: Upgrading at Mogwase and Madikwe, a total amount 1.4 of R 17,9 Million has been budgeted.
- 1.5 High Masts Lights – a total of R 12,5 Million has been allocated for Ward 25, Ward 19, Ward 13, Ward 3, Ward 14, Ward 28, ward 30 and Ward 1.

Consolidated Overview of the budget is as follows:

Total operating revenue has decreased by R58,1 Million rand or by 6% for 2021/2022 for 2021/2022 Adjustment budget.

The decrease is mainly decrease in equitable share which has decreased by R65.7 Million.

Total operating expenditure for 2021/2022 financial year has increased by R71.4 Million as compared to 2020/2021 Adjustment budget.

Operational expenditure has increased by 8.6% in the 2021/2022 Adjustment budget.

Deficit is mainly due to the increase in the following:

Debt impairment increase with R24 274 Million as result of Nonpayment of services rendered.

The allocation to the municipality for the 2021/2022 financial year is as follow:

EPWP R 1708 Million

MIG R5 027 Million

Property rates

The revenue on property rates increased from R148 602 to R149

SALARIES

The total salaries decreased from R270 Million to R260 Million. The total salaries of employees and Councillors represents 31% of total expenditure budget.

The total final Capital budget for 2021/2022 financial year amount to R233. 760 Million funded as follow:

- Ÿ Despite on working on a One/third workforce, the municipality managed to complete some projects using MIG funding.
- Y Sta complement: about 49 employees have recently been formally appointed on various units as Millwright, Process Controller, General assistants: Pumps, General assistant: Water. This will help address the challenges of water crisis, a lot of water interruptions at various villages. The municipality does acknowledge that water is life especially during this time whereby water is one of the elements used to fight against Covid-19.
- Y Mogwase reservoir has been successfully completed and has a capacity to supply water to local communities. The municipality aims to get funding so that can construct Bodirelo reservoir to be able to increase supply of water.
- Ÿ 23 residents of the MKLM are currently undergoing a learnership programme (Training in arts).
- Y Other 49 young people will start on the 01st July 2021 on a workplace exposure programme for 12 months.
- Ÿthe municipality will continue using this Newsletter to reach out to both internal and external stakeholders.

Director for Community Services Mr Segale Kotsedi said the project will empower previously disadvantaged communi es "our communi es have long being marginalized and this is an opportunity to correct this imbalances and community par cipa on is key to achieve this" he concluded.

Cllr. Matshaba highlighted the importance of trees in our lives "trees plant a vital role in our communi eshence we should look a er them, they are part of the eco-system" she said.

Mayor Ralesole Diale thanked the Department for iden fying MKLM to pilot the project "we are grateful for having chosen us out of all the Municipality and we will certainly look a er this tree because they also help in the fight against dimate change and global warming said Mayor Diale.

Moses Kotane Local Municipality partnered with Anglo-American Mine as well as *YOUTHAT WORK* to create a 12 months' work exposure programme for local youth. This can be seen as one of the "*YES*" programme which is a joint initiative by Private

sector and Government aimed at assisting South African youth to gain workplace experience.

Big companies like Anglo-American Mine approach YOUTH AT WORK employment agency as funders to implement recruitment of young people who will be in a 12 months contract gaining workplace experience. Youth at work employment agency then implements that and ensures every month there is a progress report compiled on the programme.

Head of Department for Local Economic Development Ms Gabonewe Ridah Madikela stated that, as the Municipality Department of Local Economic Development, we have partnered with Anglo-American Mine as well as Youth at work so as to create a platform that promotes youth employment. Most importantly as the municipality, we want to create an environment in which it create resources, expand new opportunities through innovation and partnerships with other private sectors.

HOD for LED concluded that, this is a 12 months programme wherein 49 young people will be given a workplace experience. They will be expected to work 40 hours, 07h30-16h30 daily earning a stipend worth R3 760 monthly. They will formally start on the 01st July 2021 and will be placed in various municipal units/ function namely Traffic Unit, Finance, Town planning, ICT, Communications, EPWP, LED, OHS/Covid-19 Screeners etc said HOD for LED Ms Gabonewe Rida Madikela



MKLM has been and is continuing prioritising development of infrastructure projects to the communities. Without a doubt, there have been a great e ort in rendering the following services such as Water supply, Sewage collection and disposal, Refuse removal, Municipal roads and storm water drainage, Street lighting, Municipal parks and recreation etc.



- Y <u>Development of infrastructure</u>: Moses Kotane Local Municipality has since 2016 successfully upgraded a total of 30.7 km of internal roads from gravel to paved road and 460 of storm water.
- Y <u>Ventilated internal pit-latrine (VIP)</u>: a total number of 3386 ventilated VIP through the rural sanitation programme has been successfully completed.
- Ÿ <u>High mast lights</u>: a total number of 144 High Mast lights programme has been successfully installed that increased public lighting and prevented heightened crime.
- Y <u>Water</u>: access to water increased to more than 37 villages within our municipality.
- Y <u>Community halls</u>: a lot of villages were provided with newly built community halls which will enable community meetings to be successfully held.
- Y Landfill site: Successfully completed rehabilitation of Mogwase and Madikwe Landfill sites.

HANDOVER OF THE ADMINISTRATION BLOCK






