1. FOREWORD OF THE CHAIRPERSON

The 2019/2020 Oversight Report just like the 2018/2019 report is being tabled while we still continue to experience the devastating impact of coronavirus which affects all corners of the globe, currently 3.1million people have died worldwide including 54 186 South Africans if it were not of steadfast leadership of our beloved President Cyril Matamela Ramaphosa thing would have been worse.

The current public hearings were conducted under level 1 restrictions which limited attendance to a 100 indoors at the time of Council resolution, later changed to 250 by the state President during his Easter Holidays speech. Hence it was decided that all clusters of Public Hearings be held in one central venue which was the Council Chamber.

Also due to financial constrains we had to prioritise our ward committees over the rest of the people as we believe they too are the true presentative of our communities and they will be expected to disseminate the information.

We regret the non-participation of the wards committees from the following wards: ward 28, ward 29 and also ward 20 whereas ward 10 was represented by only 1 member, this due to confusion, miscommunication and poor arrangements, we believe with necessary cooperation especially of Ward Councillors involved this could have avoided.

Another disturbing trend was the unavailability of a majority of Ward Councillors for various reasons some which where avoidable, however the show went on regardless. Our communities appreciated the role played by management especially the CFO to keep the Municipality as a going concern and financially viable despite poor revenue collection, unlike other Municipalities in the Province our Municipality is still able to meet and honour its obligations.

What is concerning is that our communities still continue to experience major hardship, poor roads, shortage of water and slow pace by Eskom to energise high mast light hence we still sit with a backlog of as far back as 2012.

The incoming Council and MPAC committee must continue to device ways and means to deal with the unresolved historical Irregular Expenditure of a billion, failing which this Municipality will struggle to get an Unqualified Audit opinion.

This year in May will be exactly one year since the passing of our late speaker Vava who is the founding MPAC Chairperson in our Municipality. We will forever be indebted to him as a committee. I personally dedicate this speech to him. He will forever be missed.

I also want to send a warm message on behalf of my fellow MPACERS to Councillor Ranko Phillip Motlhaga and wish him a speedy recovery since he has been sick for a while.

To all my fellow MPACERS without singling out any one, thank you for your unwavering support. Without you, I would not be referred to as Chairperson. Even though we come from different ideologies, this did not affect our commitment to root out maladministration and ensuring that management and the executive are held accountable.

To the MM, we still wish you a speedy recovery. To management, thank you for your support. To the CFO, thank you for availing yourself throughout the whole process from day one and setting aside your other demanding schedule. This municipality is fortunate to have a dedicated person of your calibre. Our prayers is that you remain loyal to this institution and not be enticed by other municipalities.

And to all those who made it possible that the MPAC office is fully staffed bar for one position of a Data Capture and a Researcher, thank you.

To the hard working staff in my office, thank you for proving your competence. Thank you for working hard even during the pandemic and for working overnight including holidays to produce this report. Give the incoming MPAC Committee the same support and respect you gave us.

To the Mayor and your Executive, thank you for your support. To the TROIKA, thank you all. To the speaker, though you are fairly new in your role, you are always there when we need you.

To all Councillors, irrespective of party affiliation, thank you. At the time of compiling this foreword, October 27th was already proclaimed by the State President as the date for the coming Local Government Elections.

Let's go and fight a good battle for the sake of serving our communities and not for self-serving reasons. We must be honest and apologise to them where we failed, we wish you well. All outgoing Councillors and those who will be fortunate to comeback, good luck we all need it.

1. PURPOSE

To consider the Municipality's Annual Report for the 2019/2020 financial year and adopt Municipal Public Accounts Committee Oversight Report on the Annual Report 2019/2020.

2. BACKROUND

The Annual Report for 2019/2020 financial year was tabled on the 30th March 2021. Council approved and adopted the report and mandated the Municipal Public Accounts Committee to facilitate Oversight Report on Annual Report 2019/2020.

In terms of section 129 of the MFMA the Council of the municipality must consider the Annual Report of the municipality by not later than two months from the date on which the Annual Report was tabled in the Council in terms of section 127, adopted an Oversight Report containing the Council's comments on the Annual Report.

3. MPAC RECOMMENDATIONS

- a) That Council take note of the Oversight Report for the year under review 2019/2020.
- b) That Council implement all recommendations set hereunder by the Municipal Public Accounts Committee.
- c) That the Oversight Report be made public in accordance with section 123 (3) of the MFMA.
- d) That the Oversight Report be submitted to the Provincial Legislature in accordance with section 132 (2) of the MFMA.
- e) That Council note that the municipality has once more received a qualified audit opinion with few matters of emphasis than in 2018/2019.
- f) That Council through the department of corporate services develop a policy to regulate employee allowances as it related to the risks involved in the execution

- of certain tasks to avoid situations brought about by the Covid-19 allowances paid to certain employees.
- g) That the incoming council be encouraged to fill all critical posts especially the following:
 - HEAD OF DEPARTMENT CORPERATE SERVICES.
 - HEAD OF SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT.
- h) That Council take steps to minimise the ever growing irregular expenditure.
- i) That Council note the significant improvement on Property Plant and Equipment (PPE) as this has been a recurring finding.
- j) That Council note that ICT still forms the biggest item in terms of the irregular expenditure.
- k) That the disciplinary board be strengthened to be able to deal with cases that are brought before for through investigations.
- l) That Council implement urgent measures to improve revenue collection as currently council is solely dependent on grants.
- m) That Council together with Magalies Water Board finalise their dispute around the water colouring which affects especially residents of Mogwase leading to poor services payment which affects revenue collection.
- n) That the Municipality seek provincial and national Government's clarity on the billing of consumers in rural areas.
- o) That the Municipality ensures it relinquishes all ownership of RDP houses in its name to respective individual beneficiaries as a matter of urgency.
- p) That the LED department capacitate the majority of SMME'S to ensure that they are skilled to avoid unskilled entrepreneurs masquerading as business forums that hijacks projects and causes delay in the implementation of such project.
- q) That councillors led by the office of the Speaker together with the MPAC embark on an awareness campaign to teach our people the difference between MPAC public hearings and IDP community consultations.
- r) That Council approve the Oversight report.

4. INTRODUCTION

The Oversight Report is the final major step in the annual reporting process of a municipality. Section 129 of the Municipal Finance Management Act, 56 of 2003 requires the council to consider the annual report of its municipality and to adopt an oversight report containing the council's comments on the annual report. The purpose of the annual report is to:

- Provide a record of the activities of the municipality;
- > Provide a report on performance in service delivery and against the budget;
- > Provide information that supports the revenue and expenditure decisions made
- > Promote accountability to the local community for decisions made

Municipal Public Accounts Committee appointed by council in accordance with the provisions of section 79 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the Municipal Structures Act 1998, to amongst other to oversee the content of the annual report on its behalf.

The 2019/2020 Annual Report was tabled in council on the 30 March 2021. This was done in compliance with section 127 (2) of the MFMA, 56 of 2003 which states that the mayor of the municipality must, within seven months after the end of a financial year, table in the municipal council the annual report of the municipality and of any municipal entity under the municipality's sole or shared control.

The final step of reporting is for the municipality to consider and adopt the annual report in light of the Findings contained in the Oversight report. In terms of the new guidelines, the oversight report must be compiled by MPAC in consultation with members of the community and other stakeholders.

5. LEGISLATIVE MANDATE FOR THE OVERSIGHT REPORT

Section 129 of the MFMA (Act 56 of 2003) states that the Council of the municipality must consider the Annual report of the municipality and by no later than two months from the date on which the Annual report was tabled in Council, adopt an Oversight Report containing the Council comments on the annual report, which must include a statement whether the council has:

- > Approved the Annual Report with or without reservations;
- > Rejected the Annual Report; or
- > Has referred the Annual report back for revision of those components that can be resolved.

9. QUESTIONS AND REPONSES ON THE ANNUAL REPORT MEETING WITH MANAGEMENT & EXCO

1. QUESTIONS POSED BY MPAC TO MANAGEMENT

Cllr Victor Kheswa:

- Wanted to know if MPAC ever summon employees, either current or former employees who are responsible or liable for irregular expenditure to come and account to the committee.
- Does the municipality have the accurate stats of the number of households where the waste collection service is being rendered by the municipality?
- Is it proper for a ward councillor to sign off the verification forms for waste collection in the villages?
- He raised an issue on traditional councils that interferes with the projects allocated to their villages by the municipality. He made a plea that the matter be attended to as it causes disputes between the two parties.
- He requested a report on all ICT related matters for people who have resigned but are still in possession of municipal laptops and cellphones.
- Cllr Kheswa raised an issue on local schools and small businesses that uses municipal water but do not pay for the service he further requested that an urgent attention be given to the waste collection that has been done for free in villages hence the municipality does not benefit from that.
- He raised his concern regarding revenue collection stating that the issue needs to be seriously addressed in order for the municipality to generate funds and also to be sustainable.
- A progress report on energizing of high mast lights by Eskom must be provided.
- He expressed his appreciation and thanked that the VIP toilets projects were done and accurately so.

Cllr Lawrance Kapari:

• Stated that on the issue of Employee Related Cost which includes the covid-19 allowance, a policy on Danger allowance must be drawn-up to assist in resolving these kind of unforeseen risks in future.

- He raised an issue on ICT relating to municipal laptops that were reported to have been installed with mobile trackers but there hasn't been any proof provided for the installation and there hasn't been any verification done.
- Requested that the UIFW expenditures on ICT from previous years must be seriously attended to as AG was not provided with required documentation.
- He wanted to get clarity on the condonement of R6 million amount that was for the project of houses. Was the project from the municipality or from the provincial housing department?
- Made an emphasis that the executive committee and senior management must ensure verification of issues before referring to the disciplinary board.

Cllr Ralesole Diale (Mayor)

- Indicated that issue of water at Ledig has been dealt with but now there seems to be a waste of water which costs the municipality a lot of money that communities does not pay for.
- Raised a concern on RDP houses which are allocated to people even though happy letters are not issued, that really affects the municipality because they still appear in the asset register.
- He emphasized Human Resource unit must speed up the process of drawing up the policy on Danger Allowance and provide a progress report in a week's time.
- Cllr Diale requested that senior management and the executive committee must seriously meet in order to attend to the issue of UIFW expenditures and that should be referred to the municipal disciplinary board.
- He also highlighted that people should be called to account on previous issues relating to UIFW expenditures.

Cllr Solomon Manganye

- The outstanding challenges that faces the municipality, especially the most spoken about issue of Employee Related Cost and the issue of ICT that negatively affect the performance of the municipality.
- He requested that a progress report be provided on revenue collection because there was done that the municipality should not provide water to clinics, schools and not maintain provincial roads.
- Stated that there is no law enforcement in the municipality and must be relooked because that also costs the municipality.
- Raised his concerns over consequence management. Employees are suspended do not go for disciplinary hearing and the process end up lapsing. This is also one of the contributing factor in the performance of the municipality.

Cllr Nketu Nkotsoe

- Expressed her concern regarding energizing of high mast lights as that is the most complaint about issue in various villages.
- She then applauded management for a good administration work they are doing.

9.1. MANAGEMENT COMMENTS

- The CFO, Mr Mzwandile Mkhize: Clarified that the bulk debt of the municipality is water, but so far businesses properly paying for water, he mentioned that the only problem only consumers who are not willing to pay for water. He further explained to councillors that the highest municipal expenditure incurred was from overtime, fuel, repairs and maintenance paid to workers.
- Mr Boikanyo Maseloane mentioned that an engagement was done between Eskom and the municipality In terms of energizing of high mast lights.
- Mr Matome Makgoba (HOD: Planning/Acting MM: Gave clarity on the filling of the Corporate Services HOD post that a meeting was scheduled for shortlisting and there were disagreements during that meeting on who were to be shortlisted, further explaining that the process collapsed because of disagreements by the panel. He went on to explain that there was a second attempt where a representative from He then explained to councillors that the municipality can't appoint someone who doesn't qualify

COUNCILLORS AND WARD COMMITTEE INPUTS

Clir Hendrick Sekao

- Raised an issue on the community halls which are build but not maintained.
- He also appreciated the work and the commitment of MPAC regarding Annual report that is presented to them.
- He requested that the performance report be made more specific especially on issues of projects in wards.
- He emphasized that councillors must be well informed and on board before going to the communities.

Cllr Solomon Mabitsela

- Made a suggestion that on the MPAC public hearing program ward 15 must be joined with ward 33.
- He said that only Sandfontein will be allocated VIP toilets this coming financial year. He also stated that the Lerome VIP toilets project does not appear on the report and it is usually clubbed together with Sandfontein.
- **Clir Patrick Tame** made a correction on the number of VIP toilets allocated to Mabele-a-Podi are 141 not 152

Cllr Thato Motshegare

- Requested an engagement between the underperforming contractors.
- He also wanted to know if the municipality responsible for energizing of the high mast lights.

Cllr Gladys Kgarimetsa

• Raised an issue that they have 52 outstanding VIP toilets.

Clir Solomon Tladi

• Wanted to know why the Voordonker water underground optimization project does not appear on the report.

RESPONSES

- **Mr Papi Moranye** stated that the Ramokokastad and Masekoloane road construction is ongoing. The municipality paid Eskom and they have promised that they will energize the high mast lights soon.
- Clir R Diale (Mayor): Told councilors that it is the municipality's responsibility to push Eskom in terms of energizing the high mast light.
- Mr. Papi Moranye: Voordonker water project was for 2017/2018 financial year the only problem was that was delayed is that the payments were outstanding.

Richard Motlhabane

 Spoke about the pipes which have burst and are not maintained. He wanted to know what happens to the maintenance budget.

WARD 19

- It was noted that there are burst pipes which cause continuous leakages as they are not fixed properly.
- The internal road in zone 10 needed maintenance.

Rebecca Segaetsho

- Mentioned that chemicals were not delivered for the VIP toilets.
- She also said that there is an increase in criminal activity due to the lights which are not working.

He informed the committee that the contractor was meant to work for five months but ended up working for three months instead. This affected the workers as they had anticipated to work for the full five months.
- Jane Mopedi stated that the halls in Makweleng and Seolong do not have electricity. She added that out of the nine high mast lights that were constructed, only five of them are working. She then asked for clarity regarding the VIP toilets which are said to be 163 in the Performance Report as opposed to the 137 in reality.
- Johanna Mosianoka questioned how the Pella bulk water supply project is 100% complete if water is still a challenge in Thatlhaganyane. He mentioned the 10.5 km internal road leading to the Mabeskraal Tribal

- Mr. Jerry Sefatsa
 Assured everyone that the municipality would find out what happened to the rest of the toilets.
 - Mr. Mzwandile **Mkhize** explained that a framework is used in terms of reporting. He proposed that the Auditor General be part of these engagements in order for them to hear suggestions by community members, especially regarding the audit action plan. He made it clear that the municipality required revenue in order to maintain all projects.

He requested that the Post Audit Action Plan be given to all stakeholders. He mentioned the business chamber, and proposed that they get included in the initial stages of a project as he believes that they could assist the municipality immensely. He then complained that contractors dig trenches which are left uncovered and trenches endangers the community especially small children.
- Ms. Naledi Boikanyo stated that some of the high mast lights in Bapong were fixed while others weren't. She then informed everyone that there are new sections in the village where waste is not being collected.

WARD 26

- Ms. Popi Masire directed everyone to page 21 of the Performance report (summarized report) and asked what measures were taken for underperforming contractors. She called for MPAC to visit RDP's which do not have toilets.
- Mr. Mogotsi Moruane advised the municipality to have a bulk water supply initiative and yard connections so that community members can be billed. He mentioned the mountains which direct water straight into the village and suggested that a dam be built to capture this water and then purify it for household consumption. He further added that Eskom should be called to energize high mast lights immediately after construction. He then stated that the hall in Tweelagte does not have water or electricity and the toilets do not work.
- Mr. Amos Mompei pleaded for the maintenance of high mast lights. He questioned the process of finding out why some people were not approved for RDP houses.

She wondered whether the municipality does not monitor projects while they are in progress. She emphasized that halls also need to be monitored and suggested that this be the responsibility of community members

makes it difficult for certain areas to receive water. He added that the reservoir needs to be enlarged and this is fortunately in the process of happening. He addressed the issue of the wires sticking out of the high mast lights, stating that electricians will be sent to fix it. addressing the backlog. He stated that there is a phase 3 project in ward 26 which will address the water issue. He made it very clear that high mast lights do not get a high budget, and it would be more viable to reduce lights and prioritize water. He added that it would take a while before the municipality addresses all issues with Eskom. He mentioned that each project has a 12 month period where all faults need to be fixed if needs be. He stated that dug trenches will be attended to. This will be done by opting to buy building sand from trusted sources instead of buying it in the village. He made everyone aware that processes are followed for underperforming contractors to improve or else leave the project. He finally asked the chairperson that stakeholders be educated on what their role is.

Lesobe Ruele raised a concern that high mast lights are always switched on and when the globes are finished they are not replaced.

WARD 22

Monnica Phefo spoke of the three high mast lights in 1 in Legogole section, in Selocha Section and 1 in Tlapane section, which are not working. She then mentioned a road that leads to Machama School where there is a pipe that is exposed. Heavy rains make it difficult to access this road.

WARD 31

Ipeleng Moeti requested for the allocation of projects in their ward.

Jacob Sentsho informed the committee that the clinic in Manamakgotheng only has two nurses and asked the municipality to kindly intervene as new sands are Mr M. Mkhize clarified that some projects are not completed due to the delay caused by business forums. He added that there is no policy which guides the municipality to award 30 % of the project to these forums. When such projects are halted, the municipality moves to a different project.

- Mr S. Kotsedi assured everyone that the head of clinics in Moses Kotane, Mr Mokotedi, will be engaged regarding the issue in Manamakgoteng clinic. - The matter of the water trucks at Ledig: It was explained to the Office of the Traditional Council of Bakubung and ward committees that water trucks are being returned back to Wesizwe Mine because there was a misunderstanding between the Bakubung Traditional Council and Wesizwe Mine. Whereby the Traditional Council and the Mine had their own agreement and when they handed over the trucks to the municipality as a form a donation, they did not go deeper into the contract. So that has led to the trucks been taken back due to the misunderstanding between the two entities. The municipality will now be operating with only two trucks that belongs to it until the mine and the traditional council resolve their issues.

Clarified that the pump station a Ledig bulk water supply is into 3 phases. The current pump station is phase 1 which is 100% complete. Phase 2 and 3 are yet to come whereby phase 2 is for the reservoir in Zulu section and phase 3 is for water reticulation. So when the report states that the bulk water supply is 100% complete it does not mean the Bakgatleng reservoir. She said that a team came and tested the reservoir that's when they noticed that it was leaking and they had to refurbish it whereby it is currently been attended to.

Mr. Benjamin Nkge

 He explained that there is an issue with Magalies Water Board regarding the Ledig pump station where there is a meter connection that the municipality did at the pump station and the connection is regarded as illegal by Magalies as they

- allude that the municipality did not apply for the connection of that meter but the HOD, Mr Maseloane is currently in talks with Magalies.
- Mentioned that a team came to check the reservoir in Bakgatleng and indeed it is leaking but it will be clubbed together with the one of Zulu section (phase 2)
- Emphasized that the municipality purchases water from Magalies and according to the municipality the water should be clean because there's a unit of compliance which was previously known as quality assurance unit. The duty of this unit is to check the quality of water hence he mentioned that the municipality expects clean water from magalies as there is a service provider who is hired to check the quality of water before it be used.
- He gave clarity that when there has been a pipe burst, after repairing the pipe and restoring water there will obviously be some soil inside the pipes and that

- sometimes takes some time to clear completely in the pipes. But that does not mean that the water it dirty though he promised that they make some improvements in future.
- Stated most of the reservoirs are cleaned by Magalies so it always a problem when it comes to how clean the reservoir is because when they do shut down they don't inform the municipality.
- A meeting was held between Bakubung baa-Raa-Theo and the municipality to intervene on the issues of water crisis. A Borehole Condition Assessment Report was done. A site visit was done on those boreholes and others there are only hand pumps, others are just open trenches. Recommendation was reached that a yield and quality test be done.

Cllr Solomon Manganye

• Informed all that the issue of electrification of halls is been attend to with Eskom and it is a backlog that goes back to 2012. Stated that

- what can be done as crucial matter is there is need to pump water then Eskom can assist mean while the municipality is still waiting for proper connection.
- Explained that on the issue of the internal road in Ledig. The process that has to happen is that after that project has been handed over there is a certain amount of money called retention which is kept by the municipality as part of payment to the contractor. That amount is kept for a period of 12 months to ensure that there are no faults or that the community is satisfied with the project. If the 12 months passes and there are no complains then the contractor will be given the outstanding amount. Now in this case the 12 months has passed and it means the bridge is now the issue of maintenance of which the municipality is still struggling with funds but that will be attended to.
- He pleaded with all ward councillors to

ensure ownership of every project that is allocated to their wards. Stressed that they should not allow any stakeholder to take over those projects so that there is a sense of accountability and to also avoid financial problems in projects and to also be able to account for projects to the Auditor General.

Ms. Mfoloe expressed her concern on projects which were started and not completed. She referred to the RDP's in Tweelagte as well as the toilets in Phalane.

Ms. L. Kgake asked who was responsible for ensuring that the WIFI at the Tlokweng Library was working or loaded with data as it has not been working for the past few years. She said the matter was taken up with the Library manager, however they have not received feedback.

Meeting with Dikgosi

Kgosi Matlapeng referred to the Annual Financial Statements report on page 1 of the summary report (income statement), and asked how much the land would cost. He then questioned who qualifies for danger allowance. Finally he asked why the debt impairment was such a significant amount.

Kgosi Mogale requested clarity on the interests incurred in terms of the expenditure finance costs. He further questioned the land which appeared to be on sale. He asked where the land was located and the size thereof. He then mentioned the balance sheet on point



1. OPENING & WELCOME

The chairperson, Cllr T. Manganye thanked Magosi for taking time to be part of the engagement. He informed them that due to Covid-19, these processes had to begin later than usual. He then asked Cllr T. Boikanyo to open the meeting with a prayer.

2. APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE

3. INTRODUCTIONS

- Individual introductions were made by councilors and officials
- Kgosi Monnakgotla introduced Dikgosi and delegated representatives from other traditional councils.

4. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

Cllr T. Manganye explained that the Auditor General audits the previous financial year statements and then makes an opinion based on the municipality's performance. He further clarified that the report is a year behind as it is from the previous financial year. He added that auditors took an extra three months due the Covid-19 hard lockdown. The purpose of the meeting was thus, for Dikgosi to be enlightened on how the municipality performed.

5. QUESTIONS (Annual Performance Statements)

Kgosi Matlapeng referred to the Annual Financial Statements report on page 1 of the summary report (income statement), and asked how much the

land would cost. He then questioned who qualifies for danger allowance. Finally he asked why the debt impairment was such a significant amount.

Kgosi Mogale requested clarity on the interests incurred in terms of the expenditure finance costs. He further questioned the land which appeared to be on sale. He asked where the land was located and the size thereof. He then mentioned the balance sheet on point number 6 (bank and cash). He asked why the grant was not spent and whether or not it would be given back to the municipality.

Kgosi Motsatsi pointed to the assets and wondered which roads the CFO was referring to in his presentation.

Kgosi Matlapeng raised the issue regarding non-current assets and asked whether the halls built in villages belonged to the Municipality or the community.

Mme P. Molatlhegi, a representative from Manamela pleaded with the municipality to take responsibility for the multi-purpose center in Manamela which is currently deteriorating. She asked whether senior management is held accountable for the findings by the Auditor General.

Kgosi Mooketsi (Brakkuil) informed members that the municipality once took a sample of the road in his village saying that they would fix it. This never happened and he thus requested that the municipality fix all roads.

RESPONSES ON THE ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

- The CFO, Mr. M. Mkhize stated that a Council resolution had been taken between 2013-2014 that land would be sold to an individual who would then have to pay it off over a period of time. This payment should have been completed by 2021. Since this did not happen, the Municipality made an executive decision not to participate in such agreements and as such, this is currently prohibited. He then assured Magosi that the Municipality would never sell land owned by the Traditional Councils.
- He explained that employee related costs referred to salaries, overtime medical aid, pension fund etc. He then clarified that office based employees qualified for the Covid-19 allowance while those working at the sewer and other risk based facilities qualified for the danger allowance. He emphasized that this was a directive from SALGA.
- He went on to give further details regarding the interests which the municipality had accumulated. He mentioned the 20 year loan from DBSA which was taken to build the Civic Centre. The loan he alluded, would end six years from now.
- He addressed the challenge of the unspent grants by clarifying that the hard lockdown affected all projects, the municipality however, managed to apply for a rollover which was accepted. Certain projects are already completed while some are in the process of completion.

- He declared that in accounting terms, assets belong to the municipality due to the financial processes which take place.
- In conclusion, he asserted that the municipality does not have yellow fleet at the moment, which makes it difficult to fix and maintain roads. However, this would be escalated to the relevant department.

QUESTIONS ON THE PERFORMANCE REPORT

Kgosi Motsatsi stated that this was the third time that the water supply project was not achieved which simply meant that there was no water in the affected village. The project was not benefiting both wards from Tlokweng and he wandered what the thinking behind the initiative was. He then asked for clarity regarding the achieved/not achieved as detailed in the report.

Mme P. Molatlhegi, a representative from Manamela expressed her concern over the fact that the community is not given feedback in terms of municipal challenges or old reported cases. She asked how the municipality identifies people who qualify for RDP's or VIP toilets. She then questioned why the contractors were slow in completing their projects. She wondered if there were no time frames or if they were not monitored.

Kgosi Matlapang requested for the document to be written in bigger font.

Kgosi Mogale asked what happened with the budget on pages 3 & 4 of the performance report. He referred to page 5 and asked why the money was over spent. He went to page 6 and stated that contractors complain that they are not paid in time. He then wondered if it was possible for Magosi to be given the Audit Action Plan.

ANSWERS ON THE PERFORMANCE REPORT

- Mr J. Sefatsa explained that according to the KPI's, if a project is pronounced as 80%, then it is complete.
- He mentioned that if projects are not completed in a certain financial year, the municipality applies for a rollover in order for them to be completed in the next financial year
- He stated that projects for roads were constructed in phases.
- **Mr S. Kotsedi** stated that it was the responsibility of the demarcation board to ensure that a village receives the same services.
- He alluded that those who are most in need of services should be prioritized.
- He mentioned that service providers are paid within 7 days of the month, therefore the delay could be caused by the Province or other Government departments.

Kgosi Motsatsi requested clarity on the intergovernmental relations in terms of projects that come from other departments.

Cllr T. Manganye informed Magosi that the province is the implementing agent for RDP houses and that the municipality takes care of statistics and criteria. He mentioned that allocation is determined by the Province.

The meeting was adjourned inconclusively due to unforeseen circumstances.

- Is it proper for a ward councillor to sign off the verification forms for waste collection in the villages?
- He raised an issue on traditional councils that interferes with the projects allocated to their villages by the municipality. He made a plea that the matter be attended to as it causes disputes between the two parties.
- He requested a report on all ICT related matters for people who have resigned but are still in possession of municipal laptops and cellphones.
- Cllr Kheswa raised an issue on local schools and small businesses that uses municipal water but do not pay for the service he further requested that an urgent attention be given to the waste collection that has been done for free in villages hence the municipality does not benefit from that.
- He raised his concern regarding revenue collection stating that the issue needs to be seriously addressed in order for the municipality to generate funds and also to be sustainable.
- A progress report on energizing of high mast lights by Eskom must be provided.
- He expressed his appreciation and thanked that the VIP toilets projects were done and accurately so.

Cllr Lawrance Kapari:

- Stated that on the issue of Employee Related Cost which includes the covid-19 allowance, a policy on Danger allowance must be drawn-up to assist in resolving these kind of unforeseen risks in future.
- He raised an issue on ICT relating to municipal laptops that were reported to have been installed with mobile trackers but there hasn't been any proof provided for the installation and there hasn't been any verification done.
- Requested that the UIFW expenditures on ICT from previous years must be seriously attended to as AG was not provided with required documentation.
- He wanted to get clarity on the condonement of R6 million amount that was for the project of houses. Was the project from the municipality or from the provincial housing department?
- Made an emphasis that the executive committee and senior management must ensure verification of issues before referring to the disciplinary board.

Cllr Ralesole Diale (Mayor)

- Indicated that issue of water at Ledig has been dealt with but now there seems to be a waste of water which costs the municipality a lot of money that communities does not pay for.
- Raised a concern on RDP houses which are allocated to people even though happy letters are not issued, that really affects the municipality because they still appear in the asset register.
- He emphasized Human Resource unit must speed up the process of drawing up the policy on Danger Allowance and provide a progress report in a week's time.
- Cllr Diale requested that senior management and the executive committee must seriously meet in order to attend to the issue of UIFW expenditures and that should be referred to the municipal disciplinary board.
- He also highlighted that people should be called to account on previous issues relating to UIFW expenditures.

Cllr Solomon Manganye

- The outstanding challenges that faces the municipality, especially the most spoken about issue of Employee Related Cost and the issue of ICT that negatively affect the performance of the municipality.
- He requested that a progress report be provided on revenue collection because there was done that the municipality should not provide water to clinics, schools and not maintain provincial roads.
- Stated that there is no law enforcement in the municipality and must be relooked because that also costs the municipality.
- Raised his concerns over consequence management. Employees are suspended do not go for disciplinary hearing and the process end up lapsing. This is also one of the contributing factor in the performance of the municipality.

Cllr Nketu Nkotsoe

- Expressed her concern regarding energizing of high mast lights as that is the most complaint about issue in various villages.
- She then applauded management for a good administration work they are doing.

RESPONSES

The CFO, Mr Mzwandile Mkhize: Clarified that the bulk debt of the municipality is water, but so far businesses properly paying for water, he mentioned that the only problem only consumers who are not willing to pay for water. He further explained to councillors that the highest municipal expenditure incurred was from overtime, fuel, repairs and maintenance paid to workers.

Mr Boikanyo Maseloane mentioned that an engagement was done between Eskom and the municipality In terms of energizing of high mast lights.

Mr Matome Makgoba (HOD: Planning/Acting MM: Gave clarity on the filling of the Corporate Services HOD post that a meeting was scheduled for shortlisting and there were disagreements during that meeting on who were to be shortlisted, further explaining that the process collapsed because of disagreements by the panel. He went on to explain that there was a second attempt where a representative from He then explained to councillors that the municipality can't appoint someone who doesn't qualify.

WAYFORWARD

• Management should revisit the timeframe of the disciplinary board and to verify the names of the members.

CLOSURE

Cllr thanked everyone for their attendance and Cllr Boikanyo closed with a prayer. The meeting adjourned at 11:45

Cllr Nketu Nkotswe was asked to do the candle lighting and open the meeting with a prayer. She requested that all Covid-19 regulations be adhered to as the pandemic is still affecting our livelihoods. She hoped that as scientists continue with their research towards curbing this virus, that one day we shall overcome.

5. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

The chairperson, Cllr Thomas Manganye explained that every year the municipality is required to develop an Annual Report consisting of financial statements as well as the performance report. These are submitted to the Auditor General for auditing purposes and then returned to the municipality with an audit opinion. The Annual report is tabled in Council and then referred to MPAC. The purpose of the meeting was thus for community members to scrutinize the report and find out how the municipality performed. Thereafter an oversight report comprising of the community's engagement would be submitted to Council.

6. QUESTIONS

WARD 1

- A question was put across about the high mast lights which have not been energized since they were installed.
- It was then stated that the hall is not in good condition and wondered whether it would be fixed.

WARD 2

• It was brought to the committee's attention that there are not enough high mast lights throughout the ward.

WARD 3

Baaneleng Dihopo

• Stated that the high mast lights in Voordonker have not worked since they were installed since 2016.

WARD 4

Linah Mokale

 Mentioned that the lights in Brakkuil and Koffiekraal need to be energized.

WARD 18

Halale Sejane

• Expressed concern over the RDP's which are still at foundation phase. She stated that community members are wondering why this project is not complete.

Richard Motlhabane

• Spoke about the pipes which have burst and are not maintained. He wanted to know what happens to the maintenance budget.

WARD 19

- It was noted that there are burst pipes which cause continuous leakages as they are not fixed properly.
- The internal road in zone 10 needed maintenance.

Rebecca Segaetsho

- Mentioned that chemicals were not delivered for the VIP toilets.
- She also said that there is an increase in criminal activity due to the lights which are not working.

Dineo Kgosimang

- Said that the internal road in Madikwe is not working.
- There are too many trenches and the sewerage system also affects it.

WARD 21

Pauline Mofaki

- Raised the issue of lights which switch on and then stop working.
- She referred to the Seshibetswe pipe burst which was fixed but then affected another section as it is not receiving any water.

Maleke Deso

• Wondered why the municipality cannot develop a prepaid system where people can pay for water.

Mpho Motsatsi

- Said that trenches were dug by the contractor who was installing high mast lights. He mentioned that they were very dangerous.
- He then asked for assistance in terms of transport to fetch wheelchairs to be given to disabled people.

7. RESPONSES

Mr Boikanyo Maseloane

- Explained that the remedial action plan to have public lighting which is off the grid did not work. This however has been escalated to the province. He said that the municipality needs to check if the lights are all still in a good condition before energizing them.
- He stated that there is water project which will commence on the 1st July 2021. He mentioned that they are still awaiting Eskom in terms of energizing most lights.
- He explained that pressure from the new system is what is causing the pipe bursts as the pipes are very old.
- He then confirmed that the consultant has been told to go and close the trenches.

Mr Puso Ntokwe

- Encouraged everyone to report pipe bursts through the call center.
- He said that they will talk to the consultant whose working on the project in Madikwe so that they don't destroy main holes.
- He addressed the issue regarding the pipe in Seshibetsoe stating that the reticulation no longer has water. He further explained that they are installing new pipes at the construction in Madikwe plant, and assured everyone that the water issue will be resolved.
- He concluded by stating that the Project Management Unit will be installing boreholes to assist Seshibetsoe and Vrede with water.

Mr Segale Kotsedi

- Assured everyone that caretakers will resume with maintaining halls. He spoke of the plan which is in place to repair all municipal resources and emphasized that this cannot be done at the same time due to financial constraints.
- He pleaded with community members to assist with illegal connections.

Cllr Nketu Nkotswe

• Said that Ms. Itumeleng Tsoku should be approached for the issue regarding wheel chairs.

Cllr Lawrance Kapari

• Mentioned that the office of the MEC has been consulted in order for them to come and assist with the issue regarding RDP houses.

Cllr Solomon Tladi thanked everyone for attending. He encouraged everyone to revert all the information back to their respective communities.

The chairperson, Cllr Manganye welcomed everyone present and apologized for any inconvenience for those who were unable to attend the meeting. He gave a brief overview of MPAC and the role it plays within the Municipality.

5. PURPOSE OF THHE MEETING

Cllr T. Manganye explained that every financial year the Municipality submits Annual Financial Statements to the Auditor General as a legislative requirement. He stated that after an approved budget, the municipality is required to give feedback on expenditures incurred as well as how the municipality performed. It needs to be held accountable for money which was either overspent, not spent according to the budget or wasted. He added that the report got delayed due to the Covid-19 hard lockdown. In conclusion, he mentioned that MPAC would submit an oversight report to Council for tabling.

6. QUESTIONS

WARD 23

Mr. Simon Ramokopelwa asked whether it's possible for the municipality to increase the amount of VIP toilets that were constructed in ward 23. He informed the committee that the contractor was meant to work for five months but ended up working for three months instead. This affected the workers as they had anticipated to work for the full five months.

Jane Mopedi stated that the halls in Makweleng and Seolong do not have electricity. She added that out of the nine high mast lights that were constructed, only five of them are working. She then asked for clarity regarding the VIP toilets which are said to be 163 in the Performance Report as opposed to the 137 in reality.

Johanna Mosianoka questioned how the Pella bulk water supply project is 100% complete if water is still a challenge in Tlhatlhaganyane. He mentioned the 10.5 km internal road leading to the Mabeskraal Tribal Office which has not been maintained for the longest time. He then stated that the hall in Mabeskraal is deteriorating. There is no electricity and water.

WARD 24

Ms. Moni Dibobo indicated that the two halls in ward 24 were not cleaned or maintained and that the Traditional Council was awaiting chairs for the hall.

Ms. Kedibone Molefe emphasized the importance of maintaining high mast lights across all villages. She pointed out that the hall in Makoshong has not been energized since it was built in 2018. She concluded by stating that waste collection trucks no longer collect waste or put refuse bags like they used to.

WARD 25

Mr. Sello Segone suggested that the municipality conduct a roadshow that will encourage community members to pay for waste collection. He requested that the Post Audit Action Plan be given to all stakeholders. He mentioned the business chamber, and proposed that they get included in the initial stages of a project as he believes that they could assist the municipality immensely. He then complained that contractors dig trenches which are left uncovered and trenches endangers the community especially small children.

Ms. Naledi Boikanyo stated that some of the high mast lights in Bapong were fixed while others weren't. She then informed everyone that there are new sections in the village where waste is not being collected.

WARD 26

Ms. Popi Masire directed everyone to page 21 of the Performance report (summarized report) and asked what measures were taken for underperforming contractors. She called for MPAC to visit RDP's which do not have toilets.

Mr. Mogotsi Moruane advised the municipality to have a bulk water supply initiative and yard connections so that community members can be billed. He mentioned the mountains which direct water straight into the village and suggested that a dam be built to capture this water and then purify it for household consumption. He further added that Eskom should be called to energize high mast lights immediately after construction. He then stated that the hall in Tweelagte does not have water or electricity and the toilets do not work.

Mr. Amos Mompei pleaded for the maintenance of high mast lights. He questioned the process of finding out why some people were not approved for RDP houses.

WARD 27

Ms. Jane Nyasango said that the hall in Mmorogong does not have electricity and the ceiling was deteriorating. She wondered whether the municipality does not monitor projects while they are in progress. She emphasized that halls also need to be monitored and suggested that this be the responsibility of community members.

RESPONSES TO QUESTIONS

- Mr. Jerry Sefatsa assured everyone that the municipality would find out what happened to the rest of the toilets.
- Mr. Mzwandile Mkhize explained that a framework is used in terms of reporting. He proposed that the Auditor General be part of these engagements in order for them to hear suggestions by community members, especially regarding the audit action plan. He made it clear that the municipality required revenue in order to maintain all projects.
- Mr. Segale Kotsedi spoke of the MOU which will be developed in order to manage the halls. He explained that caretakers were not working during the hard lockdown which resulted in some of the halls looking neglected. He then noted the waste collection complaint.
- **Clir Nkentu Nkotswe** stressed that if RDP's do not have toilets, then that matter has to be investigated as these come as a package. She explained that all required documents need to be submitted for the

allocation of RDP's. She made everyone aware of the trend where people sell their RDP houses and also encouraged that no one should take a happy letter if their allocated house has problems. She also emphasized that a person can only sell or renovate an RDP house is only after 5 years of ownership.

- Mr. Benjamin Nkge explained that Thatlhaganyane has a reservoir where there is a booster pipe which moves water from one point to the next. He elaborated that these pipes are old which makes it difficult for certain areas to receive water. He added that the reservoir needs to be enlarged and this is fortunately in the process of happening. He addressed the issue of the wires sticking out of the high mast lights, stating that electricians will be sent to fix it. He made it clear that since villages are not billed for their water, it would not make sense for the municipality to have a bulk water supply as it was suggested. He then informed everyone that plans are in place to ensure that water will go all the way to the west. He clarified that a damn could be built but there was no way that the water could be purified. He warned that those responsible for illegal connections would get disconnected if they do not adhere to the initial warning.
- Clir Solomon Manganye underlined that projects are implemented through phases and thus, the 137 toilets would be increased as the Municipality is addressing the backlog. He stated that there is a phase 3 project in ward 26 which will address the water issue. He made it very clear that high mast lights do not get a high budget, and it would be more viable to reduce lights and prioritize water. He added that it would take a while before the municipality addresses all issues with Eskom. He mentioned that each project has a 12 month period where all faults need to be fixed if needs be. He stated that dug trenches will be attended to. This will be done by opting to buy building sand from trusted sources instead of buying it in the village. He made everyone aware that processes are followed for underperforming contractors to improve or else leave the project. He finally asked the chairperson that stakeholders be educated on what their role is.

7. VOTE OF THANKS

Cllr **Solomon Tladi** thanked the chairperson for leading the proceedings. He acknowledged and appreciated all inputs. He urged councillors and officials to continue making necessary efforts to improve the performance of the municipality. He encouraged the idea for the community to assist the municipality in bringing in revenue.

8. CLOSURE

Cllr Manganye closed the meeting with a prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 14:45

WARD 12

Bontle Bosielo applauded MPAC, the CFO and the Infrastructure Department for their efforts in ensuring that the municipality does not regress.

WARD 17

Lesego Serole stated that the municipality said that they would fix the internal road in Lerome especially because it was not completed. She requested that this be fixed.

Lesobe Ruele raised a concern that high mast lights are always switched on and when the globes are finished they are not replaced.

Jane Ntsoe spoke of the three lights which are not working. She then stated that the pavement to the clinic is poorly constructed as water accumulates on the road after heavy rainfall.

RESPONSES

- Cilr T. Manganye explained that the issue with nurses is a national
 one. He elaborated that most clinics are facing the challenge of being
 understaffed as most vacancies have not been filled. He said that the
 municipality will meet with the hospital board to see how this can be
 resolved.
- **Mr M. Mkhize** clarified that some projects are not completed due to the delay caused by business forums. He added that there is no policy which guides the municipality to award 30 % of the project to these forums. When such projects are halted, the municipality moves to a different project.
- Mr S. Kotsedi assured everyone that the head of clinics in Moses Kotane, Mr Mokotedi, will be engaged regarding the issue in Manamakgoteng clinic. He warned community members about the disadvantages of illegal water and electricity connections. He added that leaving animals to roam free causes accidents. He informed everyone that by-laws are being developed to address this, also making everone aware that there is a safe and clean campaign which aims to keep the environment clean and reduce criminal activities.
- Cllr B. Manganye stated that more toilets will be allocated to Sandfontein. He made them aware that sub-contractors and beneficiary lists are often what causes delays in the commencement of projects and this should be addressed in time. He mentioned that everyone qualifies for an RDP house, but it should only be kept in mind that old and disabled people are prioritized. He encouraged members to continue to report lights which go on and off until the matter with Eskom is resolved. He agreed that the water pipe leading to Machama School needs to be fixed and that this would be

addressed shortly. He mentioned that there is a water project which will be implemented in Malebye section to deal with issues raised in that section.

7. VOTE OF THANKS

Cllr N. Ruele thanked everyone for being part of the meeting and hoped that communities would receive feedback from those who attended.

8. CLOSURE

Cllr T. Manganye wished everyone a safe journey back home and asked Doreen to close the meeting with a prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 13:25

1. OPENING & WELCOME

Cllr Manganye welcomed everyone present and wished for a fruitful engagement. Ms Tshidi Kgotlheng was asked to open the meeting with a prayer.

2. INTRODUCTIONS

Individual introductions were made.

3. APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- Cllr N. Nkotswe- engaging with Moses Kotane farmers
- Ms B. Lekgethwane- attending the District Model Workshop
- Ms L. Nthodi- family responsibility

4. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

Cllr T. Manganye explained that every year, the municipality has a set of activities it partakes in over the year. An annual report is then developed after those activities are audited and reviewed. These activities are the financial and performance aspects of the municipality. This takes approximately three months, which is why the report is a financial year behind. The purpose of the meeting was thus to go through the Auditor General's findings and be briefed on the progress report.

5. QUESTIONS

WARD 14

Thabo Moraka

- Asked for clarity in terms of how MPAC and IDP work together.
- He turned to page 15 of the performance report and stated the project progress report states that the bulk water supply at Ledig construction stage is at 61% and progress to date is 100% hence reservoir in ledig does not have water. Few months ago it was filled with water and then started leaking so it was waisting water and it was meant to be patched but that was never done.

- There were water trucks that used to assist in providing in Ledig but that is not happening anymore and no one has explained anything to the community.
- He stated that the Bakubung Traditional Council has approached the municipality to assist them with boreholes with boreholes but the municipality refused.
- Raised a question on household electrification that, it was done only in ward 28 and 30 but ward 14 was not electrified.
- Internal road in ward 30 (Bakgatleng section) is in a very bad condition. The bridge is falling apart especially when it rains heavily. He mentioned that heavy vehicles are travelling on that road and that is worsening that condition. Stated that the V-drain on that road does not serve its purpose.

Thamsanqa Witbooi

- Pleaded with MPAC to have a site visit in Ledig especially on the issue of service delivery.
- He asked if the municipality could explain the plan behind the Magalies pipe and bulk water pump station.

WARD 28

Lucky Monkwe

• Raised a concern about the big trucks from the mines that stops at Global filling station, he stated that those trucks bumps into the street lights which leads to the lights being damaged.

WARD 15

Molemo Othusitse

• Complained of dirty water which is non consumable, especially when it had been closed for some time then reopened. He emphasized the importance of having clean consumable water, especially when one is paying for it.

Johanna Mfi

- Spoke of the bridge in Lerome South leading to the cemetery which has collapsed. She mentioned that the budget was sufficient however they used cheap material to construct it.
- She mentioned that there is a road in Lerome (Thabeng section) which has an exposed pipe on it. She said that it makes the road inaccessible.
- Lastly she complained about the four culverts at Lerome, Thabeng section (next to Six Shops) that makes it difficult for water to pass through and said this creates chaos.

Tshidi Kgotlhang

- Pleaded for the bridge in Lerome South (Level 2) to be urgently attended to as it has collapsed. She wondered whether or not the bridge formed part of the Auditor General's findings.
- She stated that the waste collection truck does not collect waste in all sections.
- She then mentioned the borrow pit in the same area which is a health hazard as needles and dead animals are thrown into it. It was dug when they were constructing the main road and was left uncovered.

Joyce Tlou

Wanted to know which councillor is responsible for the area between the TT section and Welgeval. She said that there is no electricity in these areas and the community does not know where to take their concerns.

WARD 30

Patricia Mokoane

• Informed that there are boreholes in Mahobieskraal but there is no water. She requested that these boreholes be fixed and water tanks be provided.

Malenyalo Monye

- Wondered whether the stormwater in Ledig, Zulu section is still working.
- She also asked if the municipality goes back to check the progress of these projects.
- She also requested that they be given a water tank.

Andrew Kekana

- Said there are 7 high mast lights that are not working in Ledig.
- He suggested that the water which flows from the mountain at Pharama section needs to be directed to the bridge. He also mentioned a road that is not user friendly.

6. RESPONSES

Mr Mzwandile Mkhize

Raised a comment of concern that there is a vast increment of stands
that are growing, he warned the community that Moses Kotane is a very
rural municipality therefore it is struggling to raise revenue between
Mogwase and Madikwe. He mentioned that the national government has
reduced the allocation of the equitable share so some the services will
not be sped up as people expect them to be, especially when it comes to
issues of water. He also said that a general Imbizo must be called

- whereby communities can assist on how the municipality can raise money not only for refuse but also to find other alternatives on how to raise money.
- He responded to a concern that was raised whereby it was said that one
 of the municipal employee had given a directive to one community
 member to find people who will fix a without following any SCM laws. He
 explained that irrespective of the fact that he is a municipal employees
 that is regarded as irregular expenditure and that is going to affect the
 audit outcome of the municipality regardless how urgent the matter
 was. He stated that the issue of the employee will be raised with the
 relevant HOD.

Cllr Victor Kheswa

• Made a promise that he will attend to the issue of the borrow pit in Lerome South.

Cllr Tryphosa Botlhokwane

- Stated that on the issue of boreholes it was said that the Bakubung and the Municipality has no budget so the issue will be addressed in the next financial year.
- She mentioned that there are 13 boreholes in Mahobieskraal and out of those only 2 are operational and the municipality is providing diesel for them, the rest are dry. She stated that a contractor by the name of JCJ was called to check and indeed the boreholes were dry.
- The stormwater in Zulu section is working properly, even after the recent heavy rains there were no complains.
- Issue of household electrification was addressed. It was said that only ward 28 and 30 should be connected and ward 14 will be attended in the next financial year hence Cllr Lizzy Kgame has submitted a list.
- The issue of trucks that stops at Global Filling Station, the matter has been taken up with the municipality's Traffic Department but the problem is that Department of Minerals Resource (DMR) is not willing to assist as they say they do not deal with transport.
- She made an assurance that she will check the issue of demarcation between the TT section and Welgeval as to whether the portion falls under ward 15 or ward 16 according to the demarcation board.
- The matter of the water trucks at Ledig: It was explained to the Office of the Traditional Council of Bakubung and ward committees that water trucks are being returned back to Wesizwe Mine because there was a misunderstanding between the Bakubung Traditional Council and Wesizwe Mine. Whereby the Traditional Council and the Mine had their own agreement and when they handed over the trucks to the municipality as a form a donation, they did not go deeper into the contract. So that has led to the trucks been taken back due to the

- misunderstanding between the two entities. The municipality will now be operating with only two trucks that belongs to it until the mine and the traditional council resolve their issues.
- Clarified that the pump station a Ledig bulk water supply is into 3 phases. The current pump station is phase 1 which is 100% complete. Phase 2 and 3 are yet to come whereby phase 2 is for the reservoir in Zulu section and phase 3 is for water reticulation. So when the report states that the bulk water supply is 100% complete it does not mean the Bakgatleng reservoir. She said that a team came and tested the reservoir that's when they noticed that it was leaking and they had to refurbish it whereby it is currently been attended to.

Mr. Benjamin Nkge

- He explained that there is an issue with Magalies Water Board regarding
 the Ledig pump station where there is a meter connection that the
 municipality did at the pump station and the connection is regarded as
 illegal by Magalies as they allude that the municipality did not apply for the
 connection of that meter but the HOD, Mr Maseloane is currently in talks
 with Magalies.
- Mentioned that a team came to check the reservoir in Bakgatleng and indeed it is leaking but it will be clubbed together with the one of Zulu section (phase 2)
- Emphasized that the municipality purchases water from Magalies and according to the municipality the water should be clean because there's a unit of compliance which was previously known as quality assurance unit. The duty of this unit is to check the quality of water hence he mentioned that the municipality expects clean water from magalies as there is a service provider who is hired to check the quality of water before it be used.
- He gave clarity that when there has been a pipe burst, after repairing the
 pipe and restoring water there will obviously be some soil inside the pipes
 and that sometimes takes some time to clear completely in the pipes. But
 that does not mean that the water it dirty though he promised that they
 make some improvements in future.
- Stated most of the reservoirs are cleaned by Magalies so it always a problem when it comes to how clean the reservoir is because when they do shut down they don't inform the municipality.
- A meeting was held between Bakubung baa RaaTheo and the municipality
 to intervene on the issues of water crisis. A Borehole Condition Assessment
 Report was done. A site visit was done on those boreholes and others there
 are only hand pumps, others are just open trenches. Recommendation was
 reached that a yield and quality test be done.

Clir Solomon Manganye

• Informed all that the issue of electrification of halls is been attend to with Eskom and it is a backlog that goes back to 2012. Stated that what can be

- done as crucial matter is there is need to pump water then Eskom can assist mean while the municipality is still waiting for proper connection.
- Explained that on the issue of the internal road in Ledig. The process that has to happen is that after that project has been handed over there is a certain amount of money called retention which is kept by the municipality as part of payment to the contractor. That amount is kept for a period of 12 months to ensure that there are no faults or that the community is satisfied with the project. If the 12 months passes and there are no complains then the contractor will be given the outstanding amount. Now in this case the 12 months has passed and it means the bridge is now the issue of maintenance of which the municipality is still struggling with funds but that will be attended to.
- He pleaded with all ward councillors to ensure ownership of every project
 that is allocated to their wards. Stressed that they should not allow any
 stakeholder to take over those projects so that there is a sense of
 accountability and to also avoid financial problems in projects and to also
 be able to account for projects to the Auditor General.
- On the issue of water quality, he stated that the matter has been taken up
 with the provincial government and national government for intervention
 because there are some issues between the municipality and Magalies
 whereby the municipality is paying every month but magalies is providing
 dirty water.
- He warned community that they must always involve the municipality when doing things (illegal residents) in order to be included in issues like IDP and Budget.

7. VOTE OF THANKS

Cllr Solomon Tladi thanked everyone for their attendance. He hoped that everyone was well informed and that they would reverted the information back to their respective communities. He emphasized that there was no money in the municipality and that everyone should work together in order for it to stay afloat.

8. CLOSURE

Cllr Thomas Manganye said a short prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 14:00

- He wanted to know why the report for the recent auction is not appearing in the report.

• Also requested clarity on the auction of the mayoral house.

Tshilwane Setshego

• Made a correction on the performance report that VIP toilets at Mabele-a-Podi are not 152 but 142 and he further asked what happened to the 10 outstanding toilets.

Fortune Luvuno

• Laid a complain that they have been experiencing water problems since 2012 in Moruleng Green site section so he stated that he regards that as a permanent water crisis.

Lerato Mokoena

 As much as appointed contractors gets paid different amounts, projects are not well maintained, the municipality should put more effort on the scope of work that the municipality gives to contractors, he further stated that once the amount of a project changes it also affects the scope of work given.

Ward 15

Masako Thato

- Requested that the CFO should elaborate more on the issue of non-current asset.
- He then asked that as Mogwase has a reservoir, he also wanted to know when the reservoir will be operational.

Johanna Seleke

- Appreciated the CFO for taking the municipality from disclaimer to qualified audit opinion. She mentioned that the reason for the municipality to get a disclaimer audit opinion is because of human capacity in the Municipality.
- She said that the Council of Moses Kotane Local Municipality has been promoting fraudulent transactions. She raised an issue on the consultants that it is affecting the municipality.
- She requested MPAC to visit the reservoir in Mogwase that cause dirty water when doing project visits.
- Overtime that the municipality pays in Infrastructure Technical Services and community services should be limited because it really affects the municipality.

Lucky Pitso

Raised a question on what causes the water in Mogwase to be dirty.

Absalom Mataboge

• Stated that there are missing figures on the performance report.

• He raised a serious concern on TLB's that are working in Mogwase but not doing the municipal duties.

Thabang Kgwakgwa

- Appreciated and applauded the CFO for the great job he has done since he got to the municipality.
- He requested if the document can be broken down in terms of projects so that it becomes easier for the community to understand it. He also wanted to know as to when will the Mogwase reservoir is going to be used.

Maggie

• Complained about the potholes in Mogwase. She requested that a solution be found for that.

7. RESPONSES

Mr Jerry Sefatsa

• Clarified that previous financial projects which were budgeted for are the ones that appear on the report.

Mr Segale Kotsedi

- Responded that the shopping complex belongs to the NWDC, he
 informed all that there was an engagement between NWDC and the
 municipality where issues of potholes in the complex where addressed.
 The CEO of NWDC confirmed that the project should be implemented
 and soon.
- He also stated that there is a Safe and clean campaign team in the municipality and invites the community members to clean their surroundings and requested community to be part of that team.
- He raised a serious concern on illegal water connections and that some community members are aware of such but they do not report such matters.
- He informed everyone that the municipality has 548 workers of which not all position are filled.

Mr Mzwandile Mkhize

- Gave clarity that investment property land refers to land and buildings in general but in this regard it refers to land that the municipality owns.
- He stated that the recent auction was done in the current financial year and the current report that is being scrutinized is for the previous financial year.
- Also responded that on the auction of the mayoral house that it is a long process that is currently ongoing.

Mr Benjamin Nkge

- Answered the issue of ward 13 that Greenside has water because report
 has been sent that there are water pipe leaks in Moruleng green side, he
 further explained the reticulation network a team is always available to
 deal with the leaking pipes problems.
- Water projects that there's no underperforming contractors, no underground water leads to fruitless expenditure. The issue of reservoir that we must take note that the reservoir doesn't belong to the municipality but belongs to Magalies water. The reservoir will be operational soon but though it won't serve some parts of Mogwase only unit 1, 2, 8 and Mabele-a-Podi. The PRV (Pressure Reducing Valve) needs to be installed in order for the transmission of water to both reservoirs.
- Dirty water in Mogwase is caused by the dirty and old pipes in Mogwase, the was an engagement with Magalies water in terms of dirty water. He said that it must take note that there is only one team working in Mogwase and villages on the east due to Covid-19 regulations.

Cllr Solomon Manganye

- Indicated that more than 100 units of VIP toilets will be allocated again
 in Mabele-a-Podi, and no business forum or underperforming
 contractors and tribal council will interfere in the on the coming
 projects. He stated that the person who receives the projects in the ward
 is the ward councilor not stakeholders, business forums must be
 capacitated by LED (Local Economic Development) before they embark
 on the project.
- Project duration is between three and six months and it has a retention budget, he said they must have a meeting to discuss the community services overtime.
- With regards to dirty water, he explained that the matter between the
 municipality and Mgalies has been taken up to the provincial
 department and national department to intervene because the
 municipality is paying magalies but they do not supply quality water
 .requested an interference from province regarding dirty water because
 they don't want to give positive response.
- He emphasized that no material from the municipality will be used for external duties such as fixing of provincial roads and fixing of potholes in the shopping complex, there is insufficient budget to maintain things in the municipality.

Cllr Thomas Manganye thanked everyone who managed to attend the meeting and Mr. Absalom Mataboge closed the meeting with a prayer.
